Novice Division: Rider can remain in the division indefinitely, until they have accumulated 3 blue ribbons in each class.

Green Division, is a horse of any age that has not been shown for more than one show season.

Junior Exhibitor, is open to riders 17 and under

Adult Amateur, is open to riders 18 years and over who are not professionals.

Open Division , is open to all riders

Walk / Jog is open to riders of all ages, with little or no prior show experience.

General Rules and Information

Dogs: Dogs are **not allowed** on the show grounds.

Eligibility: Junior Exhibitor, is open to riders 17 and under. Adult Amateur , is open to riders 18 years and over who are not professionals. (Please refer to the HHSA rule book for further qualifications.) Open Division, is open to all riders and horses. Eligibility will be checked with the HHSA Records Keeper.

Entry Fees: Entry fees are a flat fee of \$55 for unlimited classes or \$25(up to 2 classes) or \$8 for special/lead line classes . Please refer to the entry blank.

Post Entries: MUST BE MADE PRIOR TO THE CALL FOR THE PRECEDING CLASS. Exhibitors submitting an entry blank prior to the closing date may post-enter with no extra charge, including both equitation and performance classes, providing the same horse and/or rider are listed on the original entry blank. All others may post-enter at the regular fee plus a flat \$20. In classes requiring individual work, post entries may be placed first in the starting order. *Note: A separate entry blank is required for each horse-rider combination.*

First Aid: A registered nurse, doctor or qualified first-aid personnel with suitable medical equipment will be provided during all scheduled performances. Ambulance will be on call.

Hat Rule/Attire: Riders must wear Western hat; long-sleeved shirt with any type of collar, trousers or pants and boots; (a one-piece long-sleeved equitation suit is acceptable provided it includes any type of collar). Chaps, shotgun chaps and spurs are optional. A vest, jacket, coat and/or sweater may also be worn. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty; not required to be of Western style.

Motorized Vehicles: ***Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the .Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.***

HHSA Membership: Competitors, trainers, horses and horse owners must be current members of the HHSA. Current membership numbers must be included on entry blanks, Copies of HHSA membership cards must be included with entry. Parents or guardians signing as trainer do not have to be current members. Membership can be verified with the HHSA Records Keeper.

Volunteer Requirement for Year-End Awards: To qualify for year-end awards, each HHSA member must contribute at least four (4) hours of volunteer work at HHSA-sanctioned events during the 2010 show season. A rider under 14 years of age may have a parent or other sponsor volunteer at least 4 hours on his or her behalf. For a horse to be eligible for performance awards, the rider or owner must volunteer at least 4 hours. Please contact the Show Manager if you would like to volunteer and help with this show.

Kickers: Horses that kick must be marked with a red ribbon on the tail.

Numbers: There is a \$5 fee for numbers not returned by the end of the show.

Show Hours: The arena will open at 8:30 am. Trail practice will be at a fee of \$5. Classes will start promptly at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday. In the case of public address system malfunction, it is the rider's responsibility to be on time.

Rider Order: Will be assigned according to the receipt of entries by the Show Secretary. Entries received last will be placed first in the rider order, starting with post-entries. Prizes will be awarded according to the class entered.

Refunds: After the close of entries, refunds (less \$10 for handling expenses) will be mailed only upon written certification of unsoundness by a veterinarian (or judge during the show), or in the case of personal illness, by a physician. Certifications must be received within three days after the close of the show. "No exhibitor may withdraw his/her horse from the show without permission from the Show Secretary. If he/she does so, he/she may be disqualified for the remainder of the show and his/her fees forfeited.

Tack: Correct tack must be used in all events. Regulations are stated in the HHSA & USEF Rule Book. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be familiar with and comply with HHSA & USEF rules.

Ties: Should a tie exist, Championships will be awarded according to HHSA Rule book.

Footing: Sand in the main competition and warm-up area.

Warm-Up: The main arena will be open for schooling on Saturday before the start of the show. The alternate arena will have an area designated for schooling for the duration of the show.

Dimensions: 210 x 100

Stabling: A limited number of stalls and paddocks are available with doors. See the stabling application form for details.

Directions: Circle C equestrian center is located at 41-539 Makakalo Rd. Waimanalo, Hawaii. From the Pali Hwy, Kailua bound, turn rt, onto Kalaniaole Hwy. at Castle hospital. In Waimanalo town, turn right at the stoplight onto Poalima St., bear left onto Hihimanu St. and take the second right onto Makakalo Rd, enter driveway on the left side halfway down the street.

Class Descriptions

Reining Pattern for Green , Youth and Adult pattern # 6... Open pattern #5 Patterns on HHSA website in Rules book.

Freestyle Reining Class. Please refer to NRHA rulebook for explanation and rules, the class will be for adults and youth ,and the class will be run concurrently which means that everyone rides in the same class however the placings of the youth and the adults will be awarded by their respective division .

Open Reining Horse (not worked on cattle) pattern #5

To be shown at a walk and lope without undue restraint: lope a figure-eight; run at speed; stop and turn easily. To be judged on rein, conformation, manners and appointments. Horses will be worked individually. *Instructions to riders:* Spurs or romal shall not be used forward of the cinch. While horse is in motion rider's hands shall be clear of horse and saddle.

Green Reining Horse (not worked on cattle) pattern # 6

Open to horses of any age that have not been shown in Stock Horse Classes for more than one (1) show season (partial seasons to count). To be shown at a walk, jog/trot and lope without undue restraint: lope a figure-eight; run at moderate speed; stop and turn easily. To be judged as Open Stock Horse.

Junior Rider Reining Horse (not worked on cattle) pattern#6

To be shown at a walk, jog/trot and lope without undue restraint: lope a figure-eight; run at moderate speed; stop and turn easily. To be judged on rein, conformation, manners and appointments. Horses will be worked individually. *Instructions to riders:* Spurs or romal shall not be used forward of the cinch. While horse is in motion rider's hands shall be clear of horse and saddle.

Adult Reining Horse (not worked on cattle) pattern#6

To be shown at a walk, jog/trot and lope without undue restraint: lope a figure-eight; run at moderate speed; stop and turn easily. To be judged on rein, conformation, manners and appointments. Horses will be worked individually. *Instructions to riders:* Spurs or romal shall not be used forward of the cinch. While horse is in motion rider's hands shall be clear of horse and saddle.

Trail Horse Division

This class will be judged on the performance of the horse over obstacles, with emphasis on manners, response to the rider and quality of movement. (more info in HHSA rulebook 2010)

Open Trail Horse

To be shown over and through obstacles at a walk, jog and lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint.

Green Trail Horse

Open to horses of any age that have not been shown in Trail Horse Classes for more than one (1) show season (partial seasons to count). To be judged as Open Trail Horse.

Junior Rider Trail Horse

Open to riders 17 years old and under. To be judged as Open Trail Horse

Adult Trail Horse

Open to riders 18 years old and over. To be judged as Open Trail Horse

Novice Rider Trail Horse

Open to riders of any age who have limited Western show experience. To be judged as Open Trail Horse. Competitors may remain in Novice class until they have won 3 blue ribbons in the class.

Pleasure Horse Division

Open Pleasure Horse

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both directions of the ring. To be judged on performance 60%, conformation 30%, and appointments 10%.

Green Pleasure Horse

Open to horses of any age that have not been shown in Pleasure Horse Classes for more than one (1) show seasons (partial seasons to count). To be judged as Open Pleasure Horse.

Junior Rider Pleasure Horse

Open to riders 17 years old and under. To be judged as Open Pleasure Horse

Adult Pleasure Horse

Open to riders 18 years old and over. To be judged as Open Pleasure Horse

Novice Rider Pleasure Horse

Open to riders of any age who have limited Western show experience. To be judged as Open Pleasure Horse. . Competitors may remain in Novice class until they have won 3 blue ribbons in the class.

Western Riding Horse Division

Open Western Riding Horse pattern #2

To be judged on performance with emphasis on manners 70%; appointments, equipment, neatness (silver not to count) 10%; conformation 20%. Horses to be shown in standard Western equipment.

Junior Rider Western Riding Horse pattern #2

Open to riders 17 years old and under. To be judged as Open Western Riding Horse.

Adult Western Riding Horse pattern #2

Open to riders 18 years old and over. To be judged as Open Western Riding Horse.

Green Western Riding Horse pattern #2

Open to green horses to be judged as Open Western Riding

Western Equitation Division

Open Equitation

Open to riders of all ages.

Junior Rider Equitation

Open to riders 17 years old and under.

Adult Equitation

Open to riders 18 years old and over

Novice Rider Equitation

Open to riders of any age who have limited Western show experience. Competitors may remain in Novice class until they have won 3 blue ribbons in the class.

HHSA Junior Western Seat Medal Class

1. Open to riders ages 17 years and under who are current members of HHSA. Rider to be judged 60% on equitation during collective work at the walk, jog and lope, and 40% on a pattern / test . Judges may require tests a-k listed under the Western Seat Equitation Division above. Position, hands and seat are paramount. A rider who is off pattern will be disqualified and will not receive any award except in a work-off in the case of a tie where the rider will be placed last of those chosen for the work-off.

Walk/ Jog is Open to riders of all ages. These classes are designed for the less experienced horse/rider combination who wishes to gain show experience. Classes are open to horses used regularly in a lesson program, either by an individual or with a number of students.

Note: Walk / Jog participants do not have to be HHSA members. Cross-entry in other divisions is not permitted.

Short Stirrups Lead line

Open to riders just beginning to show. No cross-entries permitted.

Starting this year, members will be required to attach a Xerox copy of their current HHSA membership cards for the rider, horse and owner, to all show entry forms. Entries will NOT be accepted without copies of your cards. If you are riding a horse that you do not own, then the owner must be a current HHSA member and provide a copy of their membership card to be attached to the entry form when needed. Note: Walk / Jog entrants are not required to pay membership fees to participate.

Freestyle Reining

This Class is NEW and being added this year there will be 2 divisions riding in the one class but they will be judged separately and placed by their respective division. Audience applause and participation is appreciated!

General Rules

Freestyle reining provides an opportunity to use the maneuvers that are required, creatively and also to expand them to music by means of choreography. Riders are encouraged to use musical scores which permit them to show the athletic ability of the horse in a crowd appealing way.

(1) NRHA rules will apply except where the following rules preempt same.

(2) Required maneuvers for adults

- (a) A minimum of four consecutive spins to the right
- (b) A minimum of four consecutive spins to the left
- (c) A minimum of three stops
- (d) A minimum of 1 lead change at the canter from right to left
- (e) A minimum of 1 lead change at the canter from left to right

(3) Required maneuvers for Jr. Exhibitors

- (a) A minimum of two consecutive spins to the right
- (b) A minimum of two consecutive spins to the left
- (c) A minimum of three stops
- (d) A minimum of 1 lead change (simple or flying) from right to left
- (e) A minimum of 1 lead change (simple or flying) from left to right

(4) Exhibitors are allowed to use (2) hands (as well as one or no hands) and any bit approved in the NRHA handbook.

(5) Additional maneuvers such as rollbacks, back ups, speed variations, and non classical reining maneuvers such as half pass, side pass are appropriate in Freestyle and shall be given appropriate credit.

(6) **TIME LIMIT ** a maximum of 4 minutes**** you can be disqualified if you go over the time limit. Time limit will be from the beginning of the intro to the end of the music.

(7) Costumes will be permitted, but emphasis is placed on performing the reining maneuvers to music.

(8) The competitor must turn in music CD to show secretary when checking in, be sure to put name on cover and any written intro, YOU are responsible for picking up your CD before the end of the show, HHSA is not responsible for it.

HHSA strongly suggests that competitors familiarize themselves with the NRHA freestyle rules by going to the NRHA website, most competitors in freestyle use the same freestyle for the whole year since they will be showing under a different judge each time they compete, bear in mind in a small arena 4 mins. Is a long time.. song choices can be edited by the competitor to shorten them and there are several free websites online, hopefully this explanation will help the membership understand the nature of this class, you can also view freestyles on you tube, type in freestyle reining to get a look at it. Liability Waiver

As stated under Hawaii Equine Law – In any civil action there is a presumption that the injury, loss, damage, or death is not caused by the negligence of an equine activity sponsor or their employees or agents.

In addition , by signing this liability waiver, the individual expressly states that he/she understands and agrees with the following statements:

- 1) that I am voluntarily participating in an equine activity which has certain inherent risks, which includes but is not limited to a horse’s propensity to act in ways which can cause injury, harm or death, a horse’s reaction to sudden sounds or movement, the existence of certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions, and the possibility of collision with other objects.
- 2) that I am voluntarily participating in an equine activity with other participants (both amateur and professional) which adds to the inherent risks by including the possibility of collisions with other horses and harm due to the negligence of another participant. Such negligence may include but is not limited to the other participant failing to properly control their horse or failing to act within the ability of the participant.
- 3) that I am aware of and acknowledge that my voluntary participation in this event may result in harm to myself, my horse, or my property. That such harm to myself may include such serious bodily injury to include broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering or death.
- 4) that I expressly assume the risk of harm to myself, my horse, or my property and agree to release HHSA from any claims, monetary or otherwise, for such harm.
- 5) that I expressly assume the risk of harm to another participant, their horse, or their property which is caused by my action or inaction and will accept responsibility for that harm(financially and otherwise).
- 6) that I agree to indemnify (reimburse) HHSA for losses, damages, or costs incurred for harm to myself, my horse, or my property or harm caused by my action or inaction to another participant, their horse, or their property.
- 7) that I agree that HHSA as used above includes all the officers, agents, members, volunteers, officials, instructors, sponsors, and those of any affiliated group.
- 8) that I hereby state both myself and my horse are eligible to participate in this event.
- 9) that I agree to follow the rules of the HHSA in general and with regard to this event as well as all applicable state and federal laws.
- 10) That I agree that as a condition of and in consideration for my participation in this event, the HHSA may use any photographs, video, audio, or any likeness of myself or my horse taken during this event, for promotion, coverage, or to otherwise benefit this event in particular or the HHSA in general. The likenesses will not be used to promote a commercial product or in any way that would jeopardize my amateur status. Therefore, I hereby waive any rights (including a right to compensation) for the use of these likenesses.
